<p><u>Eric Hall McCormick Scholarship (Postgraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to a Māori student undertaking research at postgraduate level in a field which is of significant benefit to Māori. Priority will be given to a student attending the University of Auckland.</p>	<p>\$7,500</p> <p>1 recipient</p>
<p><u>Frances Irwin Hunt Art Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students studying in the fields of performing or cultural arts at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute. Priority will be given to students with leadership skills and academic merit.</p>	<p>\$3,500</p> <p>6 recipients</p>
<p><u>Nicholas Irwin Hunt Writing Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to full-time Māori undergraduate writers (with preference to those studying in the field of journalism). Priority will be given to students with leadership skills, proven writing ability and academic merit.</p>	<p>\$3,500</p> <p>3 recipients</p>
<p><u>Norman Kirk Memorial Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students studying at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute. Priority will be given to students with financial need and academic merit.</p>	<p>\$500</p> <p>20 recipients</p>
<p><u>Pae Tawhiti Scholarship*</u></p> <p>These scholarships are available to Māori students with a record of proven academic excellence, demonstrated commitment to te ao Māori, undertaking Masters or PhD postgraduate study in a health related degree with a research focus on Hauora Māori. Study must be carried out in New Zealand. Preference will be given to those students of Ngāti Hauiti descent.</p>	<p><u>PhD</u></p> <p>\$25,000</p> <p>2 recipients</p> <p><u>Masters</u></p> <p>\$10,000</p> <p>1 recipient</p>
<p><u>Queen Elizabeth II Post-Graduate Fellowship (Postgraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to a Māori or non-Māori graduate with excellent academic ability, who plans to research at postgraduate level, in a field that will benefit Māori.</p>	<p>\$5,000</p> <p>1 recipient</p>
<p><u>Rangiriri & Mātene Te Whiwhi Winiata Scholarship (Postgraduate)</u></p> <p>Available to Māori graduates to enable them to complete postgraduate studies. Pre-requisite is completion of a master's degree.</p>	<p>\$5,000</p> <p>2 recipients</p>
<p><u>Regina Rudland Memorial Scholarship</u></p> <p>This scholarship is available to a full-time Māori student of Ngāti Porou descent, undertaking study in the field of Agriculture or Apiculture at Level 3 or higher. Priority will be given to those with demonstrated financial need. NOTE: This scholarship is included in tertiary scholarships as it is available to students studying at Level 3 or higher.</p>	<p>\$500</p> <p>1 recipient</p>

<u>Rose Hellaby Bursaries Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to Māori undergraduate students studying to become qualified or employed in a profession or calling which includes scientific, mathematical or technical skills. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and leadership.	\$1,000 30 recipients
<u>Rose Hellaby Postgraduate Scholarship (Postgraduate)</u> These prestigious scholarships are available to Māori students with a record of proven academic excellence, undertaking Masters or PhD postgraduate study in the fields of engineering, mathematics, science, technology or medicine. Study can be carried out in New Zealand or overseas.	Up to \$30,000 2 recipients
<u>Roy Watling Mitchell Bursaries Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to first-year Māori undergraduate students who attended secondary school as a Year 13 student in 2016. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.	\$1,000 24 recipients
<u>Roy Watling Mitchell Prestigious Professions Scholarship (Postgraduate)</u> Available to a Māori graduate with a record of academic excellence.	\$5,000 1 recipient
<u>Sir Apirana Ngata Memorial Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to a full-time Māori undergraduate student studying at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute, who attended Ngata Memorial College as a Year 13 student in 2016. Priority will be given to a student with academic merit.	\$1,000 1 recipient
<u>Sister Annie Henry Scholarship (open to secondary and tertiary)</u> The Sister Annie Henry Trust was established in 1972 to assist in the education or training of any direct descendants of Reverend John George Laughton, or of Tūhoe descent.	\$700 1 recipient (in total, at Secondary or Tertiary level)
<u>Ti Maru Māori Trust Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students enrolled in their final year of study at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute. Priority will be given to students with academic merit.	\$5,000 3 recipients
<u>Ti Maru Māori Trust Prestigious Scholarship (Postgraduate)</u> Available to Māori graduates with a record of academic excellence.	\$5,000 2 recipients
